KITH & KIN PROJECT

The Kith & Kin Project is a 12-week class that provides training and support to family, friend, and neighbor (FFN) caregivers. FFN caregivers are aunts, uncles, grandparents, siblings, friends, and neighbors that provide care to four or less children in their home. Each 2-hour class (provided in-person or virtually) is designed to improve the quality of care provided to children and increase FFN caregivers' knowledge about early childhood. Each weekly session focuses on a specific topic and includes information sharing, discussion, skill building, and activities. Groups are held in a supportive format where participants learn from their instructor, as well as each other.

7 Core Topics:

- Ages & Stages: Developmental Milestones of Young Children
- Brain Development
- Daily Schedules & Arranging the Environment
- Language & Literacy
- Nutrition
- Parent & Caregiver Relationships
- Positive Guidance & Discipline

Language & Literacy Technical Assistance Project (LLTAP):

- Available in some regions, LLTAP is designed to enhance the home environment for optimal language acquisition and literacy skill building.
- Each FFN caregiver receives in-home visits and financial support to create reading and writing corners.

Recent national and local research has shown that FFN providers, particularly in low-income communities, care for more than 50% of the children with working parents. Many Hispanic, African American, Native American, recently arrived refugees, and others prefer this form of care due to cultural and language considerations.





In addition, participants can also receive training in several Injury Prevention trainings including:

- CPR
- First Aid
- Home and Crib Safety
- Child Passenger Safety

As participants complete each Injury Prevention training, specific safety materials including car seats, home fire extinguishers, outlet covers, cribs, and first aid kits are made available.

What does Candelen provide?
